Rabbi's Message

Dear friends,

Most of you will, I'm sure, agree that Judaism is something important and worth saving.

Most of us do our part. Some of us are involved with Israel, others with helping support this synagogue. Some of us care about the very Jewish message of making the world a better place for all. I would suggest to you something that I think we all know but perhaps do not think of. Of all the things we can do for Judaism, the most basic one is to live the Jewish lifestyle. We are soon to celebrate Sukkot and Simchat Torah. This gives us many opportunities to honor Judaism; we honor Judaism most by attending services, eating in the Sukkah, (and this year our Sisterhood has generously provided a Sukkot luncheon), shaking the Lulav and Etrog, and dancing with the Torah. Our denunciation of Anti-Semitism and our supporting Israel is important. Our living the Jewish lifestyle however, makes the teachings of our faith come alive in a personal way.

Dancing with the Torah teaches us to celebrate G-d's word with joy. Yizkor connects us with past generations. In keeping our traditions, we are enriched. To paraphrase the words of JFK, "It is not only what you can do for Judaism but what Judaism can do for you."

As we begin the new year, let us do for Judaism, for the Jewish people and for G-d by living Judaism's lessons and its lifestyle, and in turn let Judaism do for us by its wisdom and its inspiration.

Scheduling an Oneg Shabbat or Kiddush

Among the most enjoyable parts of our Shabbat Services at the Synagogue are the Oneg Shabbats following Friday night services and the Kiddushes following Saturday morning services. The Oneg Shabbat – literally meaning Sabbath delight – consists of coffee, cake and some snacks, while Kiddush includes the blessings over wine and challah and a light luncheon. Congregants get the chance to socialize with each other and talk to the Rabbi during these occasions.

Sponsoring an Oneg or Kiddush is a wonderful way to commemorate a birthday, a Yahrzeit or other special event with your fellow congregants, friends and family, or you can sponsor for no occasion at all.

Anyone wishing to sponsor an Oneg Shabbat or a Kiddush must inform the Temple office by E-Mailing temple@templemanuel.org. An E-Mail will be sent back stating if the Oneg or Kiddush has been added to the calendar or if there is already a sponsor for that date. If you do not have E-mail, please call the Temple office and speak to the Office Manager; a post card confirmation will be sent instead of an email. Verbal requests will not be put on the calendar.

Shabbat is the time for disconnecting from the business and distraction of the everyday. In our wired world, we are more distracted than ever. Even when we are sitting with friends and family we feel the urge to check our e-mail Facebook or Twitter. Shabbat tells us to be still and hear the music of the world around us and notice the hearts and souls of the people we encounter.

Let's be in the Shabbat spirit by disconnecting our electronics, especially when we are in Shul.

Please refrain from using your electronics in the Shul on the High Holydays and Shabbat!

It is customary to dress especially nicely. Although we do not have a formal dress code, it is our tradition that in the synagogue we dress in a manner that shows respect.

Just as men wear Yarmulkes or other head coverings, it is customary for married woman to wear head coverings in the Shul such as a hat, kerchief or the chapel caps provided in the lobby.

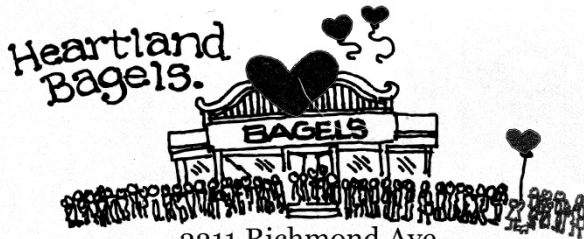
